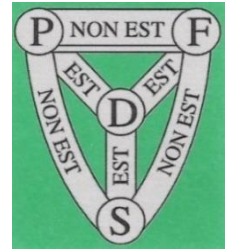

FROM THE PARISH HALL

At the beginning of this year, we looked forward with optimism as we came to terms with living with Covid, the prospect of celebrating Liberation once again and the joyous occasion of the Queen's Platinum Jubilee Celebrations. What a change the sudden passing of Queen Elizabeth II has brought to the mood of the Nation. While we feel deep sadness at the loss of this wonderful, gracious lady, who has served us all so magnificently, our spirits should be raised by the prospect of our new monarch King Charles III and what his reign will bring.

Work on the retaining wall and new public footpath at the front of the first-time buyer homes will start on Monday 10 October and is scheduled to last 33 weeks. During this time, Rue es Picots will be reduced to a single lane with traffic going from east to west only. Eastbound traffic will be diverted via Rue de La Petite Falaise/Route du Boulay. The diversions will be signposted and importantly instructions on access to the village shop will be included. If I could appeal to everyone to continue to support our local shop. Your custom will be increasingly important. The benefits of improved public safety will far outweigh the short-term inconvenience and hopefully will be the catalyst for the delivery of a much-needed programme of improvements throughout the village centre.



As in previous years we will be having a Service of Remembrance at the Ayton Memorial at Petit Port on **Friday 11 November**, but we will not be going to the Bernard Scheidhauer Memorial that day. Instead, we will be holding a special Memorial Service at Diélament on **18 November**. It will be 80 years on this day since Scheidhauer (above) crashed his Spitfire close to Diélament Manor, thus beginning the journey to his part in the Great Escape, and subsequent execution.

We will be having a **Coffee Morning** in the Parish Hall on **Saturday 12 November** 10 am to 12 noon to raise funds for the **Royal British Legion**. There will be all the usual stalls including the Grand Raffle, fresh vegetables, bedding plants and a large selection of wonderful cakes. I hope to see you there.

discombobulated at the loss of one who had so diligently and faithfully served her nation. And now, as November approaches, so does the season of Remembrance. First, in the Church, comes All Saints Day, then All Souls, the Commemoration of the Faithful Departed. Still observed by most comes **Remembrance Sunday**, this year marked on **13 November**. This is not an archaic glorification of war, or about who won – but, communities, Parishes, our Island and nation remembering the countless, and mainly, young men lost to their families, friends and communities. And it is in this spirit of remembering that we are invited to gather at 10.45 am on 13 November, at the Lychgate on Rue du Presbytère. Then at 6 pm that same day, there is an opportunity for all who still carry the ache of more recent bereavement to come together at the Parish Church to remember our loved ones. The service is entitled **Autumn Leaves** and is closely based on a similar service that takes place at Dunblane Cathedral each year. All are very welcome.



Friday 11 November, at 11 am, will see a gathering at Petit Port, on our north coast to remember Captain Philip Ayton (left), mortally wounded there. **Friday 18 November** will be the eightieth anniversary of Second Lieutenant Bernard Scheidhauer landing at Diélament and again there will be a short service of remembrance there at 11 am. All are most welcome.
